KANSAS BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD CREDIT UNION ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES • APRIL 13, 2010

CALL TO ORDER

The Annual Credit Union Meeting was called to order by Mary Beth Chambers at 5pm. It was confirmed that 12 members were present which constituted a quorum.

MINUTES

Mary Smith referred members to the minutes from last year's meeting on the tables. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as written. Motion carried. At this point, the Grand Prize winning ticket was drawn and set aside until the end of the meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mary Beth Chambers shared the credit union's effort to save paper and expense led to the Annual Report being available upon request or on the website. Pertinent details will be shared during the reports and on the overhead screen. She then went on to review the 2009 accomplishments which included a member survey conducted in July, which revealed a 4.42 overall satisfaction rating on a 5.0 scale. A couple of issues identified in the survey were convenience and lack of knowledge about all services offered. As a result, two initiatives for 2010 are a part-time branch office in Building D for BCBSKS employees and more marketing and promotion of services to educate members. Another focus for 2010 and into the future is 'your money • your credit union.' Mary Beth encouraged attendees to check with the credit union first when needing any financial service. At the conclusion of Mary Beth's remarks, she drew and announced the first door prize winner of a \$100 Visa gift card to Penny Unruh.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Pete DiDio welcomed everyone and introduced all CU staff members. Some of the accomplishments for 2009 included awarding 2 college scholarships, refreshing PAT, the Personal Audio Teller, with a long over-due upgrade, completing website enhancements, and very low delinquency levels even during difficult economic times. As a reminder, the scholarship deadline is Monday, April 19. Goals for 2010 include increasing loans, as the credit union has money to loan, promote products and services to increase awareness, and launch the new Virtual Branch, a replacement for CU@Home. He then drew the next winning ticket which belonged to Michelle Arnold. Pete's report was followed immediately with a demonstration of the new Virtual Branch by Stacy Montgomery.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Bebo Lowery-Born referred attendees to the 2009 financial highlights detailed on the screen. Assets grew 15% from 2008 to 2009, while loans increased 12% and deposits went up by 18%. During 2009, the credit union paid over \$300,000 in dividends to members or 64% of total income, which is the same level as 2008. After all expenses were paid, \$83,000 was added to reserves. Total employee membership grew during the year, ending December with 85% of BCBSKS employees as members of the credit union, demonstrating the valuable benefit the credit union offers to our members. As her final action as a board member, Bebo drew the next door prize winner, Stacy Treinen.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION

Pete presented Bebo with a plaque recognizing her 23 years of service to the credit union as treasurer of the Board of Directors. She has stepped down from her board position after giving many hours of service and leadership to the staff and members.

CREDIT COMMITTEE REPORT

Suzanne Morgan recognized the other members of the Committee, Erin Harries and CG Varble and shared the duties of the Credit Committee. During 2009, the credit union granted 755 loans for a total of almost \$6.4 million. She also pointed out the low loan delinquency ratio at 12/31/2009 was .91%, compared to a state-wide average of 1.57% and national average of 1.82%. Suzanne drew a winning ticket which belonged to Debbie Henderson.

SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Janet Blakesley recognized the other members of the Committee –Velma Lohmeyer, Karen Real, Connie Thonen, and Mark Zillinger. The Committee performed 4 surprise cash counts (including the ATMs), quarterly loan file reviews, the ACH audit, the Bank Secrecy Act compliance audit, as well as quarterly verifications of new and closed accounts. In addition, they oversaw the outside CPA audit completed by J Tenbrink and Associates and reported no significant findings on any of these occasions. The last ticket for a \$100 Visa gift card was drawn and awarded to Alicia McAdoo.

SERVICE RECOGNITION AWARDS

Ron Revelle presented Mary Beth Chambers, Janet Blakesley, Velma Lohmeyer, and Suzanne Morgan with a certificate of appreciation and thanked them for all their hard work.

ELECTIONS

The Board of Directors as the nominating committee has submitted Mayflor Dageforde and Barb Moore for the open Board positions, Marcia Henderson for the open Credit Committee position, and Jodi Harkin and Marguerite Mzhickteno for the open Supervisory Committee positions. Ron requested a motion to cease nominations and elect these nominees. The motion was made, seconded, and approved.

DOOR PRIZES

The winning prize ticket drawn at the beginning of the meeting was announced. Jane Bailey came forward to claim the \$500 Visa gift card.

ADJOURNMENT

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:40pm.
